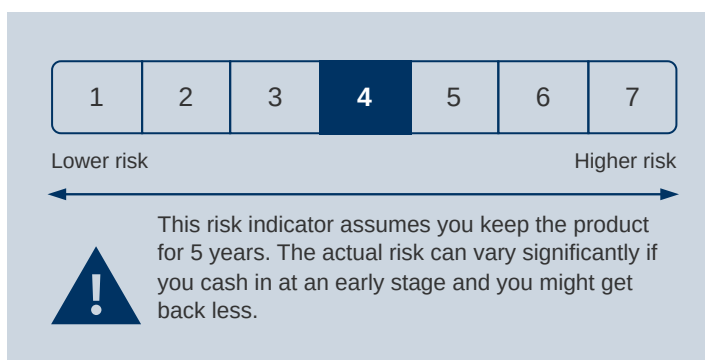

## What is this product?

<b>Type</b>	The fund is a UCITS.
<b>Maturity Date</b>	The fund has no termination date. However the Management Company may, at its discretion, decide to terminate or merge the fund or its unit series.
<b>Objectives</b>	<p>SKAGEN Vekst is an actively managed equity fund with a global investment mandate. The fund's objective is to provide unit holders with the best possible return for the risk taken by the fund, through an actively managed portfolio of Nordic and global shares. The fund shall invest at least 50 percent of its assets in companies listed or traded on the Nordic market or companies resident in the Nordic countries. The combination of a Nordic and a global mandate allows the fund to participate in value creation in sectors that are not available in the Nordic market. The fund's strategy is to invest in undervalued, high-quality companies where the portfolio managers can identify clear catalysts for their true value to be realised.</p> <p>In order to reduce risk, the fund shall seek to maintain a reasonable balance between geographical regions and industrial sectors.</p> <p>The fund deploys an ESG integration strategy to support the investment mandate. The product is therefore categorized as Article 8 as per the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation. The base currency is Norwegian Kroner (NOK). The fund does not hedge currency risk and is exposed to multiple currencies. SKAGEN Vekst does not invest in derivatives at present. Subscription and redemption in fund units can normally take place on all Norwegian business days with certain exceptions.</p>
<b>Benchmark Index</b>	The fund's benchmark index is a combination of equal weights of the MSCI Nordic Countries IMI Index and the MSCI All Country World Index ex Nordic Countries (daily traded total return net USD in NOK). The benchmark index may be used as a point of reference to compare the fund's return. The index may also be a source for selecting the fund's investments, but the composition of the fund may deviate substantially from the index.
<b>Intended retail investor</b>	The fund may be suitable for investors who want to save for a minimum of 5 years, and who are aware that the investment may fluctuate significantly in value and that there is a risk of losing money on the investment. Investment in this securities fund does not require special knowledge about or experience with mutual funds or the securities market.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets. We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level. Other risks materially relevant to the PRIIP not included in the summary risk indicator: Event risk, liquidity risk, operational risk, counterparty risk, derivatives risk and currency risk. If the fund invests in securities in a currency other than the fund's base currency, the value is affected by changes in the exchange rate. In addition, the value of your payout may be affected if your local currency is different from the fund's currency. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. ## What happens if Storebrand Asset Management AS is unable to pay out?

## What are the costs?

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed the following:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding periods, we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

## How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

### Recommended holding period: 5 years

This fund has no required minimum holding period. You may sell earlier, but the product is not suitable for investors planning to redeem their units within 5 years. Subscription and redemption of fund units can normally take place on all Norwegian business days, with certain exceptions. No additional costs will be incurred if you redeem before the recommended holding period.
